These informal presentations are designed to give you experience at public speaking in a supportive environment.

Your presentation should be no longer than 8 minutes, which will be followed by a few minutes for questions and answers. It is worth 10% of your final grade.

Select a topic that interests you, one that has some bearing on the material we are covering in the class this term. Once we have approved the topic, undertake sufficient research that you can convince your peers to adopt your point of view on the issue that you have chosen to explore.

You will receive anonymous, constructive criticism on your presentation-style from two classmates.

Additionally, you will be graded by your instructor according to how well you accomplish the following goals:

- Delivery of material in a clear, concise and professional manner (spoken, rather than read).
- Material builds on and relates strongly to course content.
- Use of visuals.
- Sources clearly identified.
- Success in fostering discussion.
- Presentation shows considerable originality and inventiveness.
